

I take this opportunity to congratulate the members of the Magazine Committee for successfully bringing out another Edition of 'Flying High'.



THE FIRST CALENDAR

A calendar is a system used to arrange time so its passing can be observed and recorded. Several calendars have been used, each new one being more accurate. Man did not always use calendars. A calendar was invented; It is not a simple task.

The difficulty arises because there are $365 \frac{1}{4}$ days in a solar year and $29 \frac{1}{2}$ days in a solar Month, where $365 \frac{1}{4}$ cannot be divided by $29 \frac{1}{2}$ days. The ancient Romans tried to device a Calendar.

In 46 B.C. Julius Caesar introduced a calendar of 12 months of 30 or 31 days except for February, which was assigned 28 days. One day was added to February in a leap year that came every four years.

In 1582 the Gregorian calendar invented by Pope Gregory XIII was changed. He decided that a century year would be a leap year but 1700, 1800, 1900 were not. The formula omits three leap years every 400 years and kept the months in agreement with the seasons. - Daisy Das - VA
