


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## **EDITORIAL**

It is meant to engage students and allow them to develop deeper understanding into current world issues.

The Nigerian Model United Nations Society (NigMUNS) was founded in 2004 and held its first conferences in 2005. NigMUNS is highly deepened in the urge and rising need to involve young people in participating and simulating the decision-making processes of the United Nations within the Nigeria context.








Only to meet again ...... We sent off Grade XII with a heavy heart to capture the wider horizons.

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






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
